It was the 1980s, and the broadcast industry:

- Introduced the use of BETA tape for News and Operations;
- Saw the introduction of microwave signals, which enabled the implementation of electronic news gathering.

In the late 1980s, REES designed Richmond, Virginia broadcasting station WRIC-TV. The station's design garnered multiple awards, including an "Energy Conservation Award" from the Passive Solar Industries Council, an "Excellence in Corporate Design" award from the American Society of Interior Design, and a "Grand Award of Excellence" from the National Commercial Builders Council.
